

Chairmans Report - 2018 Season

2018 was a disappointing season on so many fronts. In my report last year I wrote about the stark reality of how any clubs fortunes can change......this year that statement rings even louder and truer.

The challenges I mentioned last year are hugely frustrating and I'm sorry to say have manifested and grown in 2018:

- Senior players who don't or won't pay their annual subscriptions on time and in some cases not at all this is totally abhorrent and unacceptable. The club relies on subscriptions as an important stream of revenue, how can it pay its way if the members don't pay up when asked?
- Shockingly poor support from senior players and parents to help around the club do people really think things get done by themselves? The few people like myself that volunteer on a regular basis do so out of goodwill, how long that goodwill will last remains to be seen......
- 2018 has seen the poorest ever season! have ever witnessed with player availability for our senior teams. The 3rd XI were on the brink of withdrawing from the league.
- The uptake and conversion from youth 20 over cricket to open age/ senior 40 & 45 over matches was quite frankly unbelievably poor. It seemed everyone had a reason why they shouldn't, wouldn't or couldn't play. Whilst some of these reasons were perfectly explainable and understandable I would really question why as a club we support the youth cricket if most of the youth membership not interested in being challenged in longer matches and at a level commensurate to their ability. We have some very talented young players, it would be a huge shame to lose out on this talent pool. Maybe it's a cultural thing, maybe as a club we are not incentivising our young players.......what I do know is this trend must change if Hambrook CC is to survive and evolve in a very competitive local market!! Never more has it been a case of the youth must be the future mums and dads, our young players are the future of Hambrook Cricket Club please do all you can to support this please? To those youth players who were regularly available in 2018 it was hugely appreciated!!

On the field results were extremely disappointing with the 1^{st} and 3^{rd} XI's relegated. The 2's only surviving courtesy of a last day win against opponents in a winner takes all encounter.

Sunday cricket for the most part fell by the wayside due to lack of support from both youth and senior players. What was disappointing was we withdrew from Sunday league cricket to play friendlies due to issues encountered in 2017, the members voted for friendlies and yet still no one wanted to play – for heavens sake what do you want from your club?

The youth section under the guidance of Rich Carter enjoyed a good season with the U15's doing particularly well in winning their section. The U11's & U13's impressed me when I did manage to see them with their positive attitudes and always playing with a smile on their faces.

The Kwik Cricket on Sunday mornings ran again with reasonable numbers taking part.

An undoubted success was our first foray into the new ECB All Stars Cricket – 28 players signed up for an 8-week programme on Sunday mornings – great fun was had by all!!

As we say goodbye to 2018 its perhaps only right to convey my thanks to those volunteers who work both selflessly and tirelessly to provide for everyone at Hambrook:

- To all the youth managers, coaches, volunteers and youth officers please never underestimate the positive impact you guys have. Its quite often a thankless task but without you there would not be a youth section.
- To the All Stars team of Tom & Jeremy Yearsley, Richard & Carol Dyer your input and support for this new project was a massive help for me in delivering a brand-new initiative.
- To everyone that has worked on the ground again in 2018. Thanks go to Roland Allen, Rich Snell,
 Adrian Kislingbury & Rich Carter for all the pitch prep and weekly mowing of the common. Given

the extreme weather experienced this summer the common and the pitches stood up well. Some clubs provided many a substandard surface by comparison!!

- To my regular Friday night therapy companion Tom Yearsley!! between us Tom we managed for the most to keep the grass (and weeds) down around the edges of the common.
- To everyone that made the senior teas. Sarah & Tom Yearsley and Danika Dyer thank you.
- To the management committee for once again offering your input and guidance in managing the affairs of the club as best we could in 2018. We had some challenges to deal with and your support was hugely appreciated.
- To Naomi Amos who is once again overseeing our ECB Clubmark accreditation I'm pleased to report that the ECB have just signed off our Annual health check and that our accreditation is once again confirmed for 2018.
- To Dave Manley, for running the fantasy football and in doing so raising vital funds for cricket, football and Hambrook Sport Club.
- A second thank you to Dave Manley for once again auditing the club accounts.
- Vice Chairman Neil Higginson thank you Neil for being the voice of reason when things got tough and for your important work in securing an interest free loan with the parish council when our initial plan for funding for a new mower for the cricket square fell through with the ECB. You made Roland Allen a very happy man the smile on his face was a sight to behold when the new mower was unloaded in the car park....it was like Christmas morning for him
- Thank you also to Winterbourne Parish Council for you continued support of cricket on the common and the kind provision of the interest free loan mentioned above.
- To Hambrook Sports Club and having facilities that are fit for purpose. We know it creaks a bit but by comparison to some places it is a fantastic clubhouse. We need to continue to support and promote it.
- To all the senior captains you guys dealt with some very challenging situations in just getting teams out. Thank you, Martin Richardson, for stepping in at the last minute to skipper the 2nd XI and to Colin Carson for looking after the 3's with his 'enforced' promotion from vice-captain to captain.......

I'm almost certain to have missed some people off the list of thank you's – if so please accept my apologies and my sincere thanks for all your hard work.

There will be some additional and exceptional thank you's to be made, I will convey these in person at the AGM.

As 2018 ends and we start to look ahead to 2019. Despite a lot of success early in my tenure as chairman there are once again some major challenges ahead for Hambrook CC. There needs to be a significant sea change in people's attitudes and commitment. I did mention it earlier in my report, players and parents you need to step up to help when asked and not rely on the goodwill of others all the time. Sorry to be so blunt but this is just one of several things that has influenced my decision to stand down as chairman and take a well-earned and indefinite break from cricket.

Over the past 21 seasons, it has for the most been a pleasure to be involved at Hambrook. Overseeing and developing the youth section, finding additional opportunities outside of the club with the BYCL and Gloucestershire Cricket Board and finally serving as club chairman has been a huge privilege.

2019 will see a new management team in place, I wish them every success for the future.

Treasurers Report for Hambrook CC For the period 24th Oct 2017 to 20th Sept 2018.

The first point to make is that this report covers a period of 11 months rather than the normal 12 months for accounting purposes.

This should therefore be borne in mind when comparing the income & expenditure for 2018 as opposed to 2017.

Income received to our two accounts is down around 9%, whereas our expenditure has actually increased by around 11%. In monetary terms produced a surplus of expenditure over income of £2325.79, compared to a surplus of £511.78 in 2017.

This is reflected in our combined final account credit balances of £4771.01, compared to £7096.80 in 2017. So how has our income & expenditure compared for the year 2018 against the previous accounting period: On the income side, match fees reduced by around 30%, not helped of course by the loss of our Sunday fixtures this season. Annual subs reduced by around on third, as not only did we exist on a smaller number of players, but there also seemed to be a definite lethargy within the club in being forthcoming with the payment. Proceeds from social functions reduced by over 50%, as in my mind the lack of playing success brought about a lack of interest in the social side of the club.

Finally, and in order to assist in the purchase of our new wicket mower, we received a very generous interest free loan of £3490 from Winterbourne Parish Council, which will be repaid over the next 5 years. On the flip side our expenditure items remained consistent with last year. The major part of our outlay came from the purchase of a new wicket mower at a cost of £4750, and the new sightscreens at a "net" cost to the club of £2025. The result of this was that our expenditure for 2018 increased by £1670 compared to 2017, which of course would have been a lot more but for the generosity of the Parish Council!
